Admission Criteria

- Valid Ontario Health Card
- 18 years or older
- Speech and/or handwriting does not currently meet daily communication needs (or there is an anticipated decline in function)

What is Augmentative and Alternative Communication?

The Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) Clinic helps adults whose speech, language, and/or handwriting do not meet communication needs. Augmentative communication refers to devices and strategies that enhance existing speech, whereas alternative communication provides options for replacing verbal communication and/or handwriting.

Communication looks different for everyone. The AAC Clinic highly respects client goals and preferences when exploring a variety of communication aids and strategies, including, but not limited to, assistive technology. The goal is to keep clients communicating in a way that meets their needs, skills, and lifestyle - now and in the future.

Early referrals are recommended to optimize communication options and ensure timely access to services. Please note that this clinic does not provide traditional speech therapy or occupational therapy.

Our Services Include:

- Face-to-face Communication Assessment and/or Written Communication Assessment by Occupational Therapist (OT) and Speech-Language Pathologist (SLP)
- Customized equipment options (e.g. tablet with communication software or communication board)
- Customized alternatives to handwriting or using computer controls (e.g. specialized mice, keyboards, head control, eye control, etc.)
- Customized options for device mounting (e.g. table mount, mounting to wheelchair, etc.)
- Voice banking and/or message banking (available for qualifying clients only)
- · Client training
- Family/caregiver training
- Troubleshooting and technical support as needed
- Re-assessment due to changing physical or communication needs
- In-person and/or remote appointments available

Who can benefit from AAC?

- Adults whose verbal communication is unreliable, insufficient, or not well understood by others
- Adults with physical disabilities that impede functional writing and/or computer use
- Adults whose speech or written communication is anticipated to decline with progression of illness

Funding for Communication Devices

- There is no fee for the services provided by the AAC Clinic
- We are designated as an expanded level clinic by the Assistive Devices Program (ADP)
- If eligible, the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care ADP may provide funding assistance for the purchase or lease of prescribed communication aids
- Funding assistance may also be available through the Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP), extended benefits, and various organizations such as Ontario Federation of Cerebral Palsy and ALS Canada
